Five Saved As Gales Whip Surf

Unrelenting gales and boiling surf are believed to have claimed the lives of two men off the Monterey Peninsula's rocky coast over the weekend.

Five other men were saved from death in three separate rescues along the shoreline.


A home-made catamaran was found smashed and upside down on the rocks by Point Pinos yesterday morning. Two men who had been aboard the craft are missing.

The Coast Guard identified them as Carnelian O. Walker, 37, a father of four children and his brother, Mickey, 34. Both men are rem Vallejo. The catamaran reportedly was on a return p to the San Francisco Mexican waters.




