Road Will Open** **JUL 3 1946**

The Lighthouse Reservation road closed since the beginning of the war, will be opened for tourist traffic during the Centennial, it was announced today by County and Coast Guard officials.

Work has been under way on road repairs for some time, but the gates may be closed for a time following the Centennial until further repairs are completed. However, the public is assured that traffic may pass through the scenic drive from sunrise to sunset during the celebration, whether or not completion of work has been accomplished.

**About June 1st**

Congressman George Outland has been advised by the United States Coast Guard that steps have been taken to authorize the opening of the road around the Point Pinos lighthouse about June 1.

That is the substance of a wire received today by Col. Charles D. Daly, Pacific Grove, from Washington in reply to an inquiry from Col. Daly asking re-opening of the drive.

A retired Army officer, Col. Daly is a painter and has been actively interested in the movement to open the Point Pinos area to the public. It was closed during the war.

It is believed the Monterey County Board of Supervisors have agreed to repair and maintain the drive, which is a county road, and that the city of Pacific Grove will control traffic at the gate.
